The <u>Hardrock Hundred</u> is currently monitoring two fires in the San Juan National Forest in SW Colorado. The first fire known as Fire 416 is located around Durango and at about 17,000 acres in size is about 10% contained, and a second smaller Burro Fire which is burning outside of Dolores.

The Hardrock Hundred Endurance is in close contact with key officials within both the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the USFS relative to both fires as it relates to the running of the 2018 Hardrock Hundred Endurance Run.

We understand that considerable planning and resources goes into being a part of the Hardrock Hundred Endurance Run. With that in mind, as information on the fires and their possible impact on the running of the 2018 Hardrock Hundred Endurance Run becomes available to us we will work as fast as possible to pass any pertinent information along to all members of the Hardrock community.

We would encourage everyone involved with the 2018 Hardrock Hundred Endurance Run to regularly monitor the Hardrock social media channels and our website as well as the La Plata County website or on Facebook to stay as up to date as possible on the situation which remains fluid at this time.
